Subject: **Midcoast Community Council (MCC) representation on C/CAG Airport
Land Use Committee (ALUC) and Project Advisory Committee for Half
Moon Bay Airport Land Use Plan update**

Dear Mr. Napier:

The Half Moon Bay Airport is surrounded by the unincorporated Midcoast, bordered by Moss Beach, El Granada, and Princeton. An update is underway of the Comprehensive Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP) for the environs of Half Moon Bay Airport. Airport land use issues are of immediate and ongoing concern to the surrounding Midcoast communities, yet we have no direct representation on ALUC.

The City of Half Moon Bay is far enough distant that airport land use issues do not affect it, other than the benefits of having a nearby airport on the Coastsides. The City of Half Moon Bay does not represent the unincorporated Midcoast. Midcoast population exceeds that of Half Moon Bay.

The Midcoast Community Council (MCC) is an elected Municipal Advisory Council to the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors, representing the unincorporated Midcoast. The MCC requests that a position be created on ALUC for an elected MCC member and alternate, in order to give Midcoast residents more direct representation regarding airport land use issues at the center of our community. As a near-term priority, the MCC requests a place on the Project Advisory Committee for the Half Moon Bay Airport ALUCP update.
